
Welcome to Advent!

Journeying as a Family Through Advent to Christmas



A family prayer:

Dear God, We thank you for our family and we thank you for this time of Advent. Help us to be happy together and to love each other. Help us to get ready for Christmas as you would want us to. Amen.

Our Advent prayer in school; The world was in darkness and nobody knew the way to the Father as you and I do they needed a light that would show them the way and the great light shone on Christmas day.

Something fun to make:

Advent wreaths!

You will need:

Pipe Cleaners (1 Green and 2 Vellow per wreath

Beads (24 purple and 8 pink per wreath)

Green tulle (you could substitute ribbon, fabric

scraps, or evergreen

Start by making your green pipe cleaner into a circle, and twisting it together

Take a yellow pipe cleaner, and cut it in half. Thenfold one piece in half again, and pinch it over yourgreen circle. This will be your first "candle".

Take a bead, and put it over both ends of the yellow pipe cleaner. Push it down firmly. The force of the beads will hold your candle upright.

Put 7 more pony beads on, so 8 total for each candle. Push all the beads downfirmly, then open the pipe cleaner Then shape the top like a flame on a candle, bring the 2 ends together, and give them a twist ends to hold them on.

Repeat until you have an Advent wreath with 3 purple candles, and 1 pink one.

Now add "greenery" around your wreath. We first did this by tying little pieces of tulle all the way around, $t_{W_{a}}t_{W}$ style.

To do this, I'd say you need to cut your tayle in pieces about 3 inches long. If they're a little wider, the wreath gets full faster.



The wreath is round, with no beginning or ending, reminding us that God is everlasting. The greens are a sign of hope and life. They come from outside where the earth is resting, and suggest the continuation of life.

We light one candle for each week as we get ready to celebrate Jesus' birthday on Christmas Day. The Wreath reminds us that life comes around and goes around: Through it all God remains with us.
