

St Cuthbert's RC First School - PE and Sport Premium

Sport Premium is an amount of money which the government agreed to allocate to primary schools in 2013. The funding amount schools receive is based upon the number of children in the school.

Schools must spend the funding on improving their provision of PE and sport but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Vision: That all pupils leaving primary school are physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.
